^{0.)} The following applies to all prohibited acts:

If, due to a prohibited act, the opponent—following the decision of the medical staff—can no longer continue the contest, the athlete who committed the prohibited act shall be penalised with HANSOKU-MAKE and is excluded from further participation in the event.

- 1.) If an athlete loses consciousness as a result of a strangulation (shime-waza), they are prohibited from continuing the competition.
- 2.) Ippon when Uke taps, or when the success of the joint-lock (kansetsu-waza) is clearly evident.
- 3.) Continuation of a correct attack is permitted.
- 4.) Golden Score time is unlimited.
- 5.) Upon the third medical examination, the injured athlete loses the contest by kiken-gachi.
